



If you receive someone else's mail, please:

Write "not at this address" and "Return to Sender" on **the** exterior of **the** envelope. Also, cross out any barcodes and you may want to go ahead and mark out the address and recipient's name, as a piece of mail has come to the non-deliverable mail twice before I marked those out. Then place **the mail** in an outgoing **mailbox**. ...

I have found it best to put it in the mailbox at the post office.

If that doesn't work, you may put a note on the mailbox for the mail carrier or speak with them directly.

A lot of mail that is received in between renters is not for anyone that even has ever lived there as far as we know.

If it says someone's name or current resident, the current resident is you so you may do with it whatever you want.

If you know it is your neighbor's mail, please just put it in their mailbox or give it to them.

It is not illegal to open someone's **mailbox** (as long as it's not locked), and it's not illegal to personally forward **mail** to the correct address as long as the **mail** has proper postage. ...
